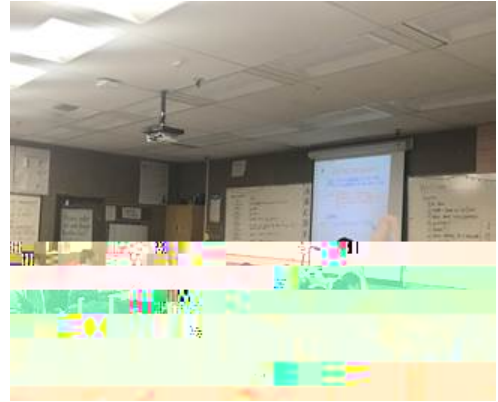

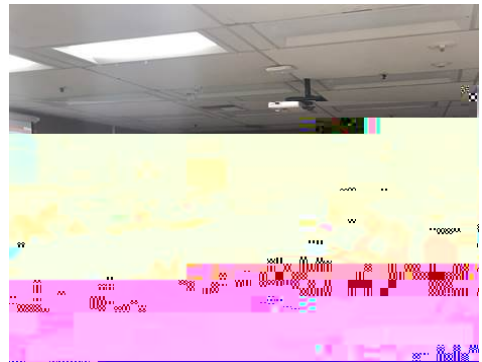
### **Nia Rashidchi: Richmond High School Summer School Program**

This summer at Richmond High School, we have some AMAZING enrichment programs going on!

1. Algebra Camp- We have 55 RHS students attending Algebra Camp. These students are all committed to making it to Calculus during their high school career, and this is their first step.



2. Newcomer Enrichment- We have 40 students, ranging from 8<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> grade, participating in our program this summer. All students are eager to increase their opportunities to speak, read, and write in English. In addition to the intense language curriculum, they are also participating in weekly field trips to help them learn the content in person. This week they visited the zoo and discussed animal research in class. Other study trips this summer include Sacramento State University and Point Reyes.



3. Intro to Calculus- 25 students are choosing to spend their summer getting ready to take AP Calculus in the fall.

4. College Is Real Summer Bridge- 21 8<sup>th</sup> grade students are eager to participate in this CIR Bridge, which is designed to help students transition to high school. Students will brush up on essential math and English skills and learn about college requirements.

5. Bay Area Peace Keepers- BAP is working on successful social skills with 15 students, ranging from 8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> grade.
